Past - UTM Initiatives of Sustainability

UTM's long-standing commitment to environmentalism includes:

- UTM's Sustainability Office
- five on-campus bee hives, 30,000 bees each, producing 1,000 pounds of honey each year
- cutting campus greenhouse gas emissions by more than 55,000 metric tons in last 10 years



Past - UTM Initiatives of Sustainability

- rooftop solar thermal systems
- ground source heat pumps
- vertical farms, harvesting more than 677 pounds of fresh produce since 2017
- BikeShare and repair café



Current - UTM Initiatives of Sustainability

- Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) status for campus buildings
- Canada's first Silver Fair Trade Campus designation in 2020 for making socially responsible decisions
- 2020 Fair Trade Canada TRAILBLAZER designation for our commitment to sustainably and ethically sourced, farmed and produced goods



Key Features Related to UTM Operations: UTM Sustainability Strategic Plan

Targets for five areas:

- Academic Programs and Curriculum
- Research
- Campus Engagement
- Civic Engagement
- Human Resources & Infrastructure

The plan features 26 goals aligned with:

- United Nations Sustainable Development Goals
- Sustainability Tracking, Assessment & Rating System of the Association for the Advancement of Sustainability in Higher Education



Future - Visions of Sustainability (Operations & Human Resources) at UTM

- cut greenhouse gas emissions by 37% by 2030 and carbon neutral campus by 2050
- divert 70% of kitchen waste through composting
- reduce single occupancy vehicles commuting to campus by 10%
- switch 50% of campus fleet to alternative fuels



Future - Visions of Sustainability (Operations & Human Resources) at UTM

- recognize UTM community members for sustainability efforts
- assess vulnerable species on campus
- increase teleworking at UTM by 25%
- construct new buildings to a minimum LEED Gold, with goal of Platinum status
